Severe allergic reactions. Some people can have severe allergic reactions to bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL). Stop taking bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL) and call your healthcare provider right away if you get a rash, itching, hives, fever, swollen lymph glands, painful sores in the mouth or around the eyes, swelling of the lips or tongue, chest pain, or have trouble breathing. These could be signs of a serious allergic reaction.

What are bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL)? Bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL) is a prescription medicine used to treat adults with a certain type of depression called major depressive disorder and for the prevention of autumn-winter seasonal depression (seasonal affective disorder).

Who should not take bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL)?

Do not take bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL) if you:
have or had a seizure disorder or epilepsy.
have or had an eating disorder such as anorexia nervosa or bulimia.

- have or not an eating disorder such as anorexita nervosa or oulimita. are taking any other medicines that contain bupropion, including WELLBUTRIN, WELLBUTRIN SR, APLENZIN®, ZYBAN, or FORFIVO XL.Bupropion is the same active ingredient that is in bupropion hydrochloride extended-release tablets (XL). drink a lot of alcohol and abruptly stop drinking, or take medicines called sedatives (these make you sleepy), benzodiazepines, or anti-seizure medicines, and you stop taking them all of a sudden.
